OUR MISSION



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EDUCATIONAL VIDEOS/ WEBINARS



STAGING GUIDE / QUIZ

PCRI has created a cancer staging system for patients. Once each patient knows his stage, he can find information about the treatments for their particular type of prostate cancer by taking a 5-minute quiz on the website by inputting details from their medical records. Knowing the stage helps patients look at their situation objectively and provides insight into the way medical professionals look at each case. Once a patient knows his stage, he can download our Staging Guide, an 80-page booklet that breaks the complex world of prostate cancer into manageable subtypes. Knowing the stage helps patients avoid unnecessary confusion from learning about treatments that do not apply to them.




DONATION
